

Double Crown

Walk a finished crown around a second time for a fuller, handsomer knob.

"Crown it once, then chase your own strands around again."

1

Start with a crown

Form a single crown but leave the ends long instead of trimming them.

2

Follow the first round

Carry each end around a second time, following the lay of the first crown so the second pass lies neatly alongside the first.

3

Keep the pattern

Push each strand through the same bights its first pass took, doubling every part of the crown.

4

Finish off

Draw all ends taut, then tuck them under the standing part or trim them close; the knot now looks like Fig. 122.
