

Double Wall and Crown

The manrope knot: double a wall-and-crown so it shows no beginning or end.

"Just follow the single wall and crown a second time all the way home."

1

Build the foundation

Make a single wall and crown it, but leave all the strands slack.

2

Re-enter the wall

Pass the ends up and through the bights of the slack single-wall knot.

3

Follow the crown

Push each end alongside the strands in the single crown, through the same bight in the crown.

4

Come back down

Carry the ends downward through the walling, simply following the strands of the single wall and crown all the way.

5

Draw and finish

Haul all ends tight and cut off closely, or taper and tuck them through the standing part so no beginning or end shows (Fig. 127).
