

Double Wall

Wall it once, then follow your strands around again for a stout double bead.

"Wall once, then trace the same path a second time around."

1

Start with a wall

Form a single wall knot but leave the ends long rather than trimming them.

2

Chase the first round

Carry each end around a second time, following the lay of the first wall so the new pass lies snug beside the original.

3

Keep the pattern

Pass each strand through the same bights it first took, doubling every part of the wall.

4

Finish

Draw all ends taut, then tuck or trim them; the knot now appears as in Fig. 123.
