

The Necklace Tie

A tidy lashing that binds two ropes or timbers side by side and locks with a square knot.

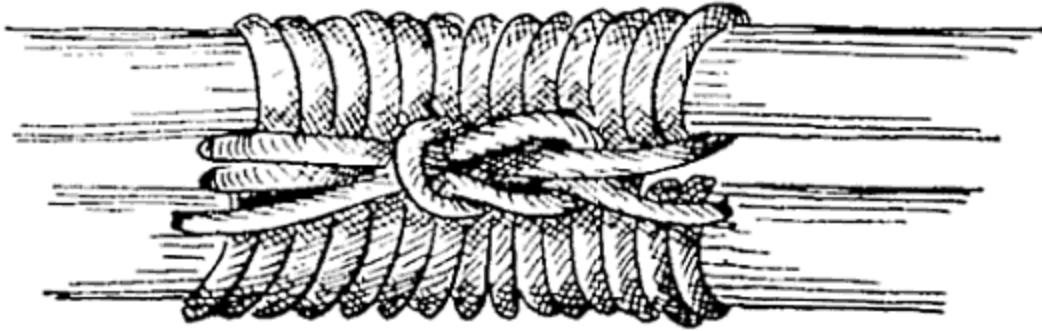


FIG. 101.—Necklace tie.

"Wrap them round and round, then square-knot the band along its length."

1

Wrap the two objects

Pass the lashing around and around the two ropes or timbers you want held side by side.

2

Bring the ends across the band

Lead the two ends around the band lengthwise, across the wrapping turns.

3

Tie a square knot

Secure the ends with a square knot snugged against the band so the bundle holds firm.
