

Throat Seizing

Open a rope's end a touch and lash it back to its standing part to form an eye.

"Open the throat, lay it back, and lash the eye shut."

1

Shape the eye

Bend the rope's end back alongside its own standing part to form the eye you want.

2

Open the end

Open the strands of the end slightly so it sits flat against the standing part.

3

Lash it down

Lash the opened end to the standing part with twine, binding the two parts firmly together as shown in Fig. 95.
