

## Wall Crowned

Cap a wall knot with a crown on top for a far better effect than either alone.

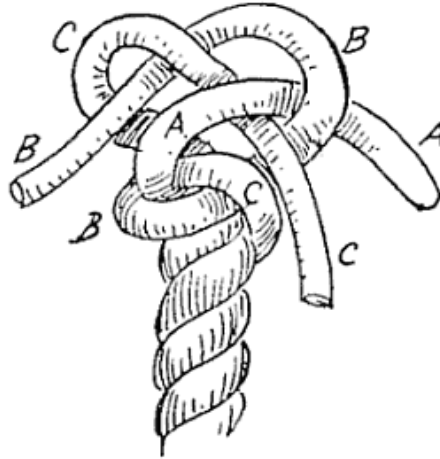


FIG. 124.—Wall crowned (making).

*"Build the wall, then crown the king sitting on it."*

### Lay the wall

First make a single wall knot in the rope's end.

2

### Raise the first strand

Bring strand A up over the top of the wall.

3

### Lay the second across

Lay strand B across A.

4

### Close the crown

Bring strand C over B and through the bight of A, forming a crown above the wall; draw snug for the look of Fig. 125.
