

Wall Knot

A crown turned upside down: the strands climb up through each other's bights.

"Down, around, and up through the bight the wall stands the crown on its head."

1

Open the end

Unlay and whip the strands as for a crown; the wall is practically a crown reversed.

2

Drop the first strand

Bring strand C downward and across the standing part.

3

Wrap the second

Bring strand A over C and around the standing part.

4

Climb up through the bight

Bring strand B over A and up through the bight of C, then draw everything snug.

5

Finish

Trim the ends close, or tuck and taper them as in the crown for the look of Fig. 116.
